Special Guest Speaker

Susan Miale, PT, DPT, PCS, is a physical therapist and Pediatric Certified Specialist through the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA). Dr. Miale is currently a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program at Stony Brook University.



Before entering into academia, she worked at The Rusk Institute of

Rehabilitation Medicine at New York University Medical Center where she gained experience in acute care, outpatient orthopedics, neurologic rehabilitation, and both inpatient and outpatient pediatrics.

Dr. Miale then attained the position of Physical Therapy Pediatric Specialist at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, where she treated children with cancer in both the acute care and outpatient setting. Dr. Miale was also responsible for continued development of the pediatric oncology program and she created a screening tool to determine the need for rehabilitation services in acute care pediatric oncology. Dr. Miale was elected Chair of the APTA's Pediatric Oncology Special Interest Group in 2014 and has worked to disseminate information to the medical community at large regarding the role of rehabilitation in children with cancer.
